# PBLD.10.05 - Anaesthetic Management Of Urgent Intrapartum Caesarean Delivery

19th WCA 2026 - 15-19 April 2026, Marrakech, Morocco

### ► Learning Objectives:

Identify clinical indications and categorization of urgent intrapartum caesarean deliveries (Category 1-2).

Formulate an appropriate anaesthetic plan based on urgency, maternal/foetal status, and existing neuraxial analgesia.

Evaluate decision-to-delivery intervals and system-level factors influencing maternal and neonatal outcomes.

Discuss strategies for optimizing communication and team readiness during high-acuity caesarean deliveries.

Anticipate and manage complications including difficult conversion from labour epidural, maternal hypotension, or conversion to general anaesthesia.

  - ii. What factors influence your choice of anaesthetic technique?

- b. Maintain clear thresholds for conversion failure
- c. Build institutional readiness and drills for urgent CD scenarios

### WS.10.01 - Massive PPH (Aortic Compression, REBOA, MTP, Resuscitation)

### ► Workshop Description:

A practical and evidence based workshop focused on special techniques for most severe cases of PPH, including accretism, and catastrophic situations. It will provide the attendant the possibility to afford the most severe and complex cases with simple and complex strategies. The fellows will also learn how to manage in case the patient needs to be transfered to another facility.

The teachers will share experience on their own use of REBOA in obstetric patients.

- b. <u>Case 2</u>: A 31 yo, BMI=35 Kg/m2, G1A0P0 at 38 weeks, she has an epidural catheter for labour analgesia, and suffers a severe uterine atony episode after delivery of a 4200 g baby. After initial resuscitative measures (TXA, Resuscitation, 2nd iv line, uterotonics and Bakri balloon she continues bleeding. She has already received 4 RPBC + Fibrinogen 4 g and bleeding is more and more severe).
